



MARY ANN FRANK (Mildred) is an actress, book writer and lyricist; she is also a practicing clinical psychologist in New Haven, CT. She is currently developing Vienna, 1902, a musical ensemble, with Andrew Levine.

JIMMY JOHANSMEYER (Zack / Donny) is an award-winning actor, costume designer and educator. For sixteen years, he was the 'resident villain' with the former Downtown Cabaret Children's Company. In 2010 he started Pantochino Productions (a not for profit



children's theatre offering ridiculously original musicals for the entire family) along with his partner Bert Bernardi. Keely has directed, choreographed, and taught a myriad of performing arts courses at such institutions as Quinnipiac University, Yale University, Fairfield University, Hartt School of Drama, Southern Connecticut State University, Westminster College, and was the Director of Education of New Haven's acclaimed Elm Shakespeare Company for several years. Her directing has been heralded by the Arts Paper as "...visually striking, emotionally moving" and "captivating" and of her direction of Hamlet it was said, "Knudsen has made the notoriously difficult Shakespearean language accessible." Her creation of the Wheel Life Theatre Troupe has been an especially rewarding program as she acts and directs with those ambulate with crutches wheelchairs. Her BFA is from New York University's Tisch School of the Arts, at which she graduated first in the class, and she received her Masters Degree in Drama on full scholarship from The Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama in Glasgow.
