

directed, and performed with the Players at Putney Gardens, which did (mostly) Shakespearean plays outdoors in the summer at Boothe Park in Stratford. When she's not being overtly theatrical, Lucy teaches 5th Grade in Milford, and spends a mind-numbing number of hours writing her fantasy novels – some of which have actually been published.



MARK FRATTAROLI (Billy) is an English and Theater teacher at Fairfield Warde High School. He has appeared at many local theaters: Square One, The Players at Putney Gardens, Town Players of Newtown, Playhouse on the Green, Eastbound Theater (The MAC), and Westport

Community Theater. With Putney (which he ran with his wife Lucy Babbitt) he has appeared as Malvolio,

Touchstone, Bottom, his favorite Benedick, Leontes in *The Winter's Tale*, and Sir Toby Belch in *Twelfth Night*. He also directs; his most recent efforts have been *The Children's Hour* and most proudly *Sunday in the Park with George*.


